



# Moon Miracle in the Valley

During his basketball career, Michael Jordan scored 32,292 points, earned six NBA championships, five NBA MVP titles, and made 14 All-Star Game appearances. He is, by acclamation, the greatest basketball player to ever grace the court. In a salute to the NBA star's legacy, *Newsweek* examined every facet of his career, from his days as a 5'10" JV high school sophomore without a dunk, to his 72-win season. In 1978, Michael Jordan was just another kid in the gym, along with 50 or so of his classmates, trying out for the Emsley A. Laney High School varsity basketball team. There were 15 roster spots.

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Jordan—then a 15-year-old sophomore who was only 5'10" and could not dunk a basketball—did not get one of the roster spots. His close friend, 6'7" sophomore Leroy Smith, did. The team needed his length. **“It was embarrassing not making the team,”** Jordan later said. He went home, locked himself in his room and cried.

Then he picked himself up and turned the cut into motivation. **“Whenever I was working out and got tired and figured I ought to stop, I’d close my eyes and see that list in the locker room without my name on it,”** Jordan would explain. **“That usually got me going again.”** Jordan, using that sizable chip on his shoulder to his advantage, spent his sophomore year as the star of the junior varsity team. He put up multiple 40-point games and attracted crowds that were unprecedented for a JV affair.

The summer leading into his junior year, Jordan began to morph. In 1979, he grew four inches and worked out constantly. That year he made the varsity squad and instantly became Laney High’s best player, averaging more than 20 points a game.



Despite having secured his spot on the team, Jordan's work ethic didn't drop off. His senior year he averaged a triple-double and led Laney High to a 19-4 record. Jordan capped off his high school career in style, being named a McDonald's All-American. He wasn't yet "His Airness," but he was well on his way.<sup>1</sup>

## **“COURAGE” Level Questions**

**C1:** After hearing the Michael Jordan story, has there ever been a time in your life when you felt as if you were not good enough? Write down the story. How did you feel?

**C2:** You may think or feel you are not good enough, but the God of Heaven sends you a special invitation. Read **Hebrews 4:16 (NLT)**. What thoughts come to your mind as you process your inadequacies through the lens of this verse?

**C3:** As a group, are there some men you could decide to actively target to build relationships with to help them walk through their challenges? List those men and ask God to inspire you or your group with a plan to connect with them and have spiritual influence with them.



## **“STRENGTH” Level Questions**

We hear or read incredible stories so often, we often overlook certain details. Read the following verses and answer the questions.

### **Joshua 10:12-13 (NLT)**

**S1:** Have you ever noticed that the moon stood still in the valley?

**S2:** Have you ever been in a “valley” part of life and felt like God was nowhere to be found?

**S3:** What emotions did you experience?



Too often we leave God out of our “valley” experiences. Read the following verses and answer the questions.

## **1 Kings 20:28 (NLT)**

## **Psalms 23:4 (NLT)**

**S4:** What do these verses speak to you regarding walking into a valley?

**S5:** Think about a valley experience you walked through in your life. How did you sense God walking with you?



## **“ENDURANCE” Level Questions**

Read these following declarations (out loud if you dare):

- I declare that Jesus Christ is the one and only Son of the Most High God and is my Savior and Lord.
- I declare the Holy Spirit empowers me to be an effective witness and servant for Him.
- I declare that I serve a God who is unchangeable, unshakeable, and unstoppable.
- I declare the Sovereignty of God will prevail in all matters pertaining to carrying out His purpose here on earth.
- I declare God is working progressively, silently, successfully, and powerfully in me right now.
- I declare God hears my prayers and that answers to prayer are on the way.
- I declare that I am blessed by our Heavenly Father, not lucky.



- I declare that where God guides, He will provide.
- I declare faith gives me the courage to face today with confidence and the future with high hopes.
- I declare that God is faithful.
- I declare the Bible is my compass, and if I follow it I cannot go wrong.
- I declare God's promises are true and will not fail.
- I declare the absolute authority of God that cannot be successfully challenged or changed.
- I make all these declarations today in the precious, powerful name of Jesus. Amen. So be it, Lord!

**Assignment:** Speak these declarations out loud daily, for the next 30 days. Make a note of what emotion(s) do you feel on the first day, the fifteenth day, and the thirtieth day?
