



God is on Sabbatical

When a crisis hits your life as a believer, it is easy to wonder, “*Where is God in this?*” Perhaps you have asked that question at least once in your life? Read the following story from my uncle Bob:

The doctor looked at me and said, “Your daughter is going to die, and there is nothing that can be done to save her.”

This was surreal. She had done nothing to deserve this. She was a victim of what I will call in this story “emotional terrorism.” We were left to just watch her die. I could not work or minister because I had to be by her side 24/7.

Hours, days, and weeks dragged by as the death slowly, but surely, moved in to grab its prey. Where






was God? Was He on a sabbatical? Had He gone on a vacation with no forwarding address?

Then another Sunday rolled around, and we could not take her to church; but I insisted that we would have church in the bedroom. The two kids were sitting on the floor, and I was in my bedroom chair. It was so simple.

I read a passage of Scripture, and we began to sing, *"He is Lord. He is Lord. He has risen from the dead, and He is Lord. Every knee shall bow. Every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord."*

I prayed a little prayer. My incredible son prayed, and then my precious daughter lifted her boney arms protruding out from the sleeves of her pink pajamas and began to pray softly. Tears began to trickle down her cheeks and her little chin began to tremble.

Words of a heavenly language began to flow from her lips, and the service was over. But God joined us somewhere during this little service with His might, all His glory, and healing power. My little, dying



daughter was healed instantly. [Later she] become a very successful pastor's wife. He was there all the time, but in our pain, we just didn't know it.¹

E1: What does this verse mean to you in the place where you are living right now?
