HELPING CHURCHES GET STARTED.

We are creating four Kits intended to assist a church as it begins or enhances a local Men's Ministry. The first Kit is titled "LAUNCH." The next three are, "**LEAD**," "**LEARN**," and finally, "**LIVE**." Here is an excerpt from "LAUNCH" that gives an explanation of the three following Kits:

Now that you have gone through the ***Launch Kit*** and have started your Men's Ministry, please know that we have three additional resources for you as you move forward with your men's group to increase the levels of spiritual health, community, service, and missions. The National Men's Ministry also has ***Lead***, ***Learn***, and ***Live*** Kits for you and your men to go through. The next kit, ***Lead Kit***, focuses on developing future leaders from within your group. ***Lead Kit*** addresses the three disciplines that are needed to develop a healthy leader: Awareness, Accountability, and Development. The focus is on spiritual formation and biblical character which will enable you to lead yourself and others. In the third, ***Learn Kit***, is a pathway to help men learn the discipleship patterns for keeping Them in the game. This important kit also gives you the resources needed to share to your group how to minister and serve in your home, church, and marketplace. The applications tools allow men to process how to minister in their home, understanding the dynamics of serving in the church and allows them to assess how to approach men in their world, introduce them to Christ, answer difficult questions, and find their place of ministry in the occupational world. Practical resources in ***Learn Kit*** will assist men in

developing a personal prayer time, devotions, and even share how to serve communion to the family. We will focus on practical skills to help steward the influence you have been given.

The fourth kit, ***Live Kit***, targets the long term win each man can have by staying the course.

Living out manhood is not an easy task and this resource gives every man the necessary tools to make that happen. We will explore how culture can try to offset our path, how temptations can sabotage the future, and how sin can destroy vision. This kit will help you formulate a plan to help you shape the culture of your home and workplace. You will begin a journey to help give you the tools to invest in the lives of those who are in your sphere of influence.

One True God

Adapted from FireBible Article: The Attributes of God by Danny Duvall

The one true God has revealed Himself as the eternally self-existent "I AM," the Creator of Heaven and Earth and the Redeemer of Mankind. He has further revealed Himself as embodying the principles of relationship and association as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.¹

The Attributes of God article gives a deeper understanding of this truth:

Psalm 139:7–8 (ESV) ⁷Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? ⁸If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!

The Bible does not seek to prove that God exists. Rather it assumes his existence and describes numerous attributes that he possesses. Some of these attributes are unique to him as God; others we see in human beings as a result of their being created in God's image.

The Unique Attributes of God

1. God is omnipresent: He is everywhere at the same time.

Acts 17:27–28 (ESV) ²⁷that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, ²⁸for “In him we live and move and have our being”; as even some of your own poets have said, “For we are indeed his offspring.”

That means God can see everything we do.

2. God is omniscient: He knows everything.

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Psalm 147:5 (ESV)⁵ Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure.

1 Samuel 16:7 (ESV)⁷ But the LORD said to Samuel, “Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the LORD sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart.”

God remains free to make decisions and alter his purposes in time and history, according to his own will and wisdom. In other words, God is not a prisoner of his own foreknowledge.

Numbers 14:17–19 (ESV)¹⁷ And now, please let the power of the Lord be great as you have promised, saying,¹⁸ ‘The LORD is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, forgiving iniquity and transgression, but he will by no means clear the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children, to the third and the fourth generation.’¹⁹ Please pardon the iniquity of this people, according to the greatness of your steadfast love, just as you have forgiven this people, from Egypt until now.”

3. God is omnipotent: He is all-powerful and has ultimate authority over all things and all creatures.

Matthew 19:26 (ESV)²⁶ But Jesus looked at them and said, “With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.”

This doesn't mean, however, that God uses all his power and authority at all times: for example, God has the power to destroy all sin, but he has chosen not to do so until the end of history. In many cases, God limits his power, channeling it through his people. In these cases, his power is dependent on our degree of availability and submission to him.

4. God is Transcendent: He is different and independent from his creation.

Isaiah 55:8 (ESV) For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the LORD.

He dwells in perfect and pure existence, far above what has been made: he himself is uncreated and exists apart from creation. Transcendence does not entail, however, that God is incapable of living among his people as their God.

5. God is eternal: He is from everlasting to everlasting.

Psalm 90:1–2 (ESV) ¹Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.

²Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

There has never, nor will ever be a time when God did not or will not exist: He is not bound by human time and is, therefore best described as “I AM.”

2 Peter 3:8 (ESV) ⁸But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

6. God is unchangeable: There is no change in God’s attributes, in his perfections or in his purpose for humankind.

Numbers 23:19 (ESV) ¹⁹God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?

This doesn’t mean, however, that God never alters his temporary purposes in response to the actions of humans. He may alter his intentions of judgment because of the sincere repentance of sinners. The Bible often speaks of God changing his mind as a result of the diligent prayers of the righteous.

7. God is perfect and Holy: He is completely without sin and absolutely righteous.

Leviticus 11:44 (ESV) For I am the LORD your God. Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I am holy. You shall not defile yourselves with any swarming thing that crawls on the ground.

Adam and Eve were created without sin, but with the capability of sinning. God on the other hand, cannot sin.

2 Timothy 2:12–13 (ESV) ¹²if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he also will deny us; ¹³if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself.

8. God is triune: He is God. Who manifests himself in three divine persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Deuteronomy 6:4 (ESV) “Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.



Matthew 28:19 (ESV) Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Each person is fully divine, equal with the other two: yet they are not three Gods, but one.

Matthew 3:17 (ESV) and behold, a voice from heaven said, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.”

The Mission of the Church

Adapted from FireBible Article: The Church by Danny Duvall

The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of her great commission. Each believer, born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the General Assembly and Church of the Firstborn, which are written in heaven.

Since God's purpose concerning man is to seek and to save that which is lost, to be worshipped by man, to build a body of believers in the image of His Son, and to demonstrate His love and compassion for all the world, the priority reason for being of the Assemblies of God as part of the Church is: To be an agency of God for evangelizing the world; To be a corporate body in which man may worship God; To be a channel of God's purpose to build a body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son; To be a people who demonstrate God's love and compassion for all the world.

The Assemblies of God exists expressly to give continuing emphasis to this reason for being in the New Testament apostolic pattern by teaching and encouraging believers to be baptized in the Holy Spirit. This experience: Enables them to evangelize in the power of the Spirit with accompanying supernatural signs; Adds a necessary dimension to worshipful relationship with God; Enables them to respond to the full working of the Holy Spirit in expression of fruit and gifts and ministries as in New Testament times for the edifying of the body of Christ and care for the poor and needy of the world.¹

The Church article gives a deeper understanding of this truth:

Matthew 16:18 (ESV) And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

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The Church of Jesus Christ is one of the few enduring endeavors of your life. The following teaching on the Mission of the church will help the Christian understand what makes the church so impactful, and identify what should be the Christian contribution to its mission.

The Greek word Ekklesia (Church) refers to a meeting of God's people called out and summoned together. This word comes from a word that means impartation of the King's rule spread into the people. As we gather together the King's delight is dispersed throughout our lives and community.

- A. The church is a community of people who come together as citizens of God's kingdom for the purpose of worshiping their Lord.

Ephesians 2:19 (ESV) So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God,

- B. The word church can refer to the local assembly or the universal church.

The Church is:

- 1. A company of the Redeemed believers made possible by Christ's death.

1 Peter 1:18–19 (ESV) ¹⁸knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

- a. It is a pilgrim people no longer belonging to this earth.

Hebrews 11:13 (ESV) These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth.

- b. Each church member's first function is to have a living, personal relationship with God.

1 Peter 2:5 (ESV) you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

2. The Church is a people called out. 'Ekklaeo' is out or called. Separation from the world and into God's kingdom is inherent to the church's nature.

2 Corinthians 6:17–18 (ESV) ¹⁷Therefore go out from their midst, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch no unclean thing; then I will welcome you, ¹⁸and I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me, says the Lord Almighty."

- a. As a member of the Church you are a moving Temple of God and of the Holy Spirit. You are an agent always ready for service.

1 Corinthians 3:16 (ESV) Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?

3. The Church is the body of Christ. This image indicates that no true church exists apart from the vital union of the members with Christ.

1 Corinthians 6:15 (ESV) Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never!

4. The Church is the bride of Christ. This marriage image emphasizes the devotion and faithfulness of the Church to Christ, as well as Christ's love and intimacy with His Church.

2 Corinthians 11:2 (ESV) For I feel a divine jealousy for you, since I betrothed you to one husband, to present you as a pure virgin to Christ.

5. The Church is a spiritual fellowship (koinonia).

2 Corinthians 13:14 (ESV) The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

This fellowship includes the indwelling of the Spirit, the unity of the Spirit, and the baptism in the Spirit. This fellowship is to demonstrate observable love and care for one another.

John 13:34–35 (ESV) ³⁴A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. ³⁵By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

6. The Church is a spiritual ministry (diakonia). We serve through gifts given by the Holy Spirit.

Romans 12:6 (ESV) Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith;

7. The Church is an army involved in spiritual conflict.

The church is in a spiritual struggle against Satan and sin. The Spirit, with which the church is filled, is like a warrior wielding the living Word of God, delivering people from Satan's dominion and conquering every power of this dark world.

Ephesians 6:12 (ESV) For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

Ephesians 6:17 (ESV) and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God,

8. The Church is the pillar and ground of truth.

1 Timothy 3:15 (ESV) if I delay, you may know how one ought to behave in the household of God, which is the church of the living God, a pillar and buttress of the truth.

Jude 3 (ESV) Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints.

9. The Church is a people with a future hope. This hope is centered in Christ's return.

John 14:3 (ESV) And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also.

10. The Church is both invisible and visible.



It is invisible in that it is united with all believers all over the world. It is visible because it is built of local congregations containing faithful overcomers, and professed Christians who are spiritually dead and lukewarm.

Revelation 2:2 (ESV) “I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false.

Revelation 2:5 (ESV) Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent.

11. The Church at its core is full of “wrinkles” or imperfection.

Ephesians 5:27 (ESV) so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.

El único Dios verdadero

Adaptado del artículo: Los atributos de Dios por Danny Duvall, Biblia de Estudio de la Vida Plena.

El único Dios verdadero se ha revelado como el eterno existente en sí mismo «YO SOY», el Creador del cielo y de la tierra y Redentor de la humanidad. Se ha revelado también encanando los principios de relación y asociación como el Padre, el Hijo, y el Espíritu Santo.¹

El artículo *Los atributos de Dios* nos da una comprensión más profunda de esta verdad:

Salmo 139:7–8 (RV-60)⁷ ¿A dónde me iré de tu Espíritu? ¿Y a dónde huiré de tu presencia? ⁸ Si subiere a los cielos, allí estás tú; y si en el Seol hiciere mi estrado, he aquí, allí tú estás.

La Biblia no procura probar que Dios **existe**. Más bien, da por sentado su existencia y continúa describiendo numerosos atributos que lo caracterizan. Algunos de esos atributos son exclusivos de Él como Dios; otros se ven en los seres humanos como resultado de haber sido creados a la **imagen** de Dios.

Atributos exclusivos de Dios

1. Dios es omnipresente: Él está presente en todas partes y al **mismo tiempo**.

Hechos 17:27–28 (RV-60)²⁷ para que busquen a Dios, si en alguna manera, palpando, puedan hallarle, aunque ciertamente no está lejos de cada uno de nosotros. ²⁸ Porque en él vivimos, y nos movemos, y somos; como algunos de vuestros propios poetas también han dicho: Porque linaje suyo somos.

Esto significa que Él ve todo lo que hacemos.

2. Dios es omnisciente: Él lo sabe todo.

Salmo 147:5 (RV-60)⁵ Grande es el Señor nuestro y de mucho poder; y su entendimiento es infinito.

1 Samuel 16:7 (RV-60)⁷ Y Jehová respondió a Samuel: No mires a su parecer, ni a lo grande de su estatura, porque yo lo desecho; porque Jehová no mira lo que mira el hombre; pues el hombre mira lo que está delante de sus ojos, pero Jehová mira el corazón.

Dios es libre de tomar decisiones que alteren sus propósitos en el tiempo y en la historia, de acuerdo a su voluntad y sabiduría. En otras palabras, Dios no es un prisionero de su propia presciencia.

Números 14:17–19 (RV-60)¹⁷ Ahora, pues, yo te ruego que sea magnificado el poder del Señor, como lo hablaste, diciendo: ¹⁸ Jehová, tardo para la ira y grande en misericordia, que perdona la iniquidad y la rebelión, aunque de ningún modo tendrá por inocente al culpable; que visita la maldad de los padres sobre los hijos hasta los terceros y hasta los cuartos. ¹⁹ Perdona ahora la iniquidad de este pueblo según la grandeza de tu misericordia, y como has perdonado a este pueblo desde Egipto hasta aquí.

3. Dios es omnipotente: Él es todopoderoso y tiene la suprema autoridad sobre todas las cosas y sobre todas las criaturas.

Mateo 19:26 (RV-60)²⁶ Y mirándolos Jesús, les dijo: Para los hombres esto es imposible; mas para Dios todo es posible.

Sin embargo, eso no quiere decir que Dios emplee todo su poder y autoridad en todo momento. Por ejemplo, Dios tiene el poder para destruir todo el pecado, pero Él ha optado no hacer eso hasta el fin de la historia. En muchos casos, Dios limita su poder, canalizándolo por medio de su pueblo. En esos casos, su poder es dependiente del grado de disponibilidad y obediencia a Él por parte del creyente.

4. Dios es trascendente: Él es diferente e independiente de su creación.

Isaías 55:8 (RV-60) Porque mis pensamientos no son vuestros pensamientos, ni vuestros caminos mis caminos, dijo Jehová.

El habita en existencia perfecta y pura, muy por encima de lo que ha hecho. Sin embargo, la trascendencia no hace que Dios sea incapaz de habitar entre su pueblo como su Dios.

5. Dios es eterno: Él es desde el siglo y hasta el siglo.

Salmo 90:1–2 (RV-60)¹ Señor, tú nos has sido refugio de generación en generación.

² Antes que naciesen los montes y formases la tierra y el mundo, desde el siglo y hasta el siglo, tú eres Dios.

No hubo ni habrá jamás un tiempo, ni en el pasado ni en el futuro, en que Dios no existir ni existirá. Él no está limitado por el tiempo humano, y por lo tanto se lo describe mejor como «Yo Soy».

2 Pedro 3:8 (RV-60)⁸ Mas, oh amados, no ignoréis esto: que para con el Señor un día es como mil años, y mil años como un día.

6. Dios es inmutable: No hay cambio alguno en los atributos de Dios, en sus perfecciones ni en sus propósitos para el género humano.

Números 23:19 (RV-60)¹⁹ Dios no es hombre, para que mienta, ni hijo de hombre para que se arrepienta. Él dijo, ¿y no hará? Habló, ¿y no ejecutará?

Eso no quiere decir que Dios nunca modifica sus propósitos temporales en reacción a los acciones de los seres humanos. Él puede modificar sus propósitos de juicio por causa del arrepentimiento de los pecadores. Con frecuencia las Escrituras se refieren a Dios como que cambia de idea a causa de las diligentes oraciones de los justos.

7. Dios es perfecto y santo: Él es íntegramente sin pecado y absolutamente justo.

Levítico 11:44 (RV-60) Porque yo soy Jehová vuestro Dios; vosotros por tanto os santificaréis, y seréis santos, porque yo soy santo; así que no contaminéis vuestras personas con ningún animal que se arrastre sobre la tierra.

Adán y Eva fueron creados sin pecado, pero con la capacidad de pecar. Dios, por otra parte, no puede pecar.

2 Timoteo 2:12–13 (RV-60)¹² Si sufrimos, también reinaremos con él; si le negáremos, él también nos negará.¹³ Si fuéremos infieles, él permanece fiel; él no puede negarse a sí mismo.

8. Dios es trino y uno: Él es un solo Dios que se ha manifestado en tres personas divinas: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo.

Deuteronomio 6:4 (RV-60) Oye, Israel: Jehová nuestro Dios, Jehová uno es.

Mateo 28:19 (RV-60) Por tanto, id, y haced discípulos a todas las naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo;

Cada persona es plenamente divina, igual a las otras dos; pero no son tres dioses, sino un solo Dios.

La Iglesia y su misión

La Iglesia es el cuerpo de Cristo, la morada de Dios por el Espíritu Santo, con el encargo divino de llevar a cabo su gran comisión. Todo creyente, nacido del Espíritu Santo, es parte integral de la asamblea general e iglesia de los primogénitos, que están inscritos en los cielos.

Siendo que el propósito de Dios en relación con el hombre es buscar y salvar lo que se había perdido, ser adorado por el ser humano, edificar un cuerpo de creyentes a la imagen de su Hijo, y mostrar su amor y compasión a todo el mundo la principal razón de ser de las Asambleas de Dios como parte de la Iglesia es: ser una agencia de Dios para la evangelización del mundo; ser una entidad corporativa en que el hombre pueda adorar a Dios; ser un canal para el propósito de Dios de edificar un cuerpo de santos en proceso de ser perfeccionados a la imagen de su Hijo; ser un pueblo que muestra el amor y la compasión de Dios a todo el mundo.

Las Asambleas de Dios existe expresamente para dar continuo énfasis a esta razón de ser según el modelo apostólico del Nuevo Testamento, enseñando a los creyentes y alentándolos a que sean bautizados en el Espíritu Santo. Esta experiencia: los capacita para evangelizar en el poder del Espíritu con señales y milagros; agrega una dimensión necesaria a la adoración y a la relación con Dios; los capacita para responder a la plena manifestación del Espíritu Santo en la expresión de frutos, dones y ministerios como en los tiempos del Nuevo Testamento, para la edificación del cuerpo de Cristo, y la atención de los pobres y menesterosos del mundo.¹

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La Iglesia de Jesucristo es uno de los pocos cometidos perdurables en nuestra vida. La siguiente enseñanza acerca de la misión de la iglesia ayudará al cristiano a entender por qué la iglesia ejerce tal fuerza y a identificar cuál debe ser el aporte del cristiano a la misión que ésta tiene.

El vocablo griego *ekklésia* (iglesia) se refiere a la reunión de un pueblo **llamado** y convocado. Este término viene de una palabra que denota la impartición del decreto del Rey hacia el pueblo. Cuando nos reunimos, la complacencia del Rey se **difunde** en nuestra vida y en la comunidad.

- 1. El conjunto de creyentes redimidos que existe por la muerte de Cristo.

1 Pedro 1:18–19 (RV-60) ¹⁸sabiendo que fuisteis rescatados de vuestra vana manera de vivir, la cual recibisteis de vuestros padres, no con cosas corruptibles, como oro o plata, ¹⁹sino con la sangre preciosa de Cristo, como de un cordero sin mancha y sin contaminación,

- a. Es un pueblo **peregrino** que ya no pertenece a esta tierra.

Hebreos 11:13 (RV-60) Conforme a la fe murieron todos éstos sin haber recibido lo prometido, sino mirándolo de lejos, y creyéndolo, y saludándolo, y confesando que eran extranjeros y peregrinos sobre la tierra.

- b. La primera función de cada miembro de la iglesia es perseverar en una **relación** personal con Dios.

1 Pedro 2:5 (RV-60) vosotros también, como piedras vivas, sed edificados como casa espiritual y sacerdocio santo, para ofrecer sacrificios espirituales aceptables a Dios por medio de Jesucristo.

2. La Iglesia es un pueblo llamado a salir. *Ekklaeo* expresa la idea de afuera o salir. La separación del mundo es inherente a la **naturaleza** de la iglesia.

2 Corintios 6:17–18 (RV-60) ¹⁷ Por lo cual, salid de en medio de ellos, y apartaos, dice el Señor, y no toquéis lo inmundo; y yo os recibiré, ¹⁸ y seré para vosotros por Padre, y vosotros me seréis hijos e hijas, dice el Señor Todopoderoso.

- a. Como miembros de la iglesia somos el **templo** móvil de Dios y del Espíritu Santo. Somos representantes de Dios siempre preparados para el servicio.

1 Corintios 3:16 (RV-60) ¿No sabéis que sois templo de Dios, y que el Espíritu de Dios mora en vosotros?

3. La Iglesia es el **cuerpo** de Cristo. Esta imagen indica que la verdadera iglesia no puede existir separada de la vital unión de sus miembros con Cristo.

1 Corintios 6:15 (RV-60) ¿No sabéis que vuestros cuerpos son miembros de Cristo? ¿Quitaré, pues, los miembros de Cristo y los haré miembros de una ramera? De ningún modo.

4. La Iglesia es la esposa de Cristo. Esa imagen del matrimonio pone de relieve la devoción y la fidelidad de la Iglesia a Cristo, y el amor y la familiaridad de Cristo con su Iglesia.

2 Corintios 11:2 (RV-60) Porque os celo con celo de Dios; pues os he desposado con un solo esposo, para presentaros como una virgen pura a Cristo.

5. La Iglesia es una **confraternidad** espiritual (*koinonía*).

2 Corintios 13:14 (RV-60) La gracia del Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios, y la comunión del Espíritu Santo sean con todos vosotros. Amén.

La confraternidad abarca la morada del Espíritu, la unidad en el Espíritu, y el bautismo en el Espíritu. La confraternidad debe mostrar amor **visible** y cuidado mutuo.

Juan 13:34–35 (RV-60) ³⁴ Un mandamiento nuevo os doy: Que os améis unos a otros; como yo os he amado, que también os améis unos a otros. ³⁵ En esto conocerán todos que sois mis discípulos, si tuviereis amor los unos con los otros.

6. La Iglesia es un **ministerio** espiritual (*diakonía*). Servimos a través de los dones conferidos por el Espíritu Santo.

Romanos 12:6 (RV-60) De manera que, teniendo diferentes dones, según la gracia que nos es dada, si el de profecía, úsese conforme a la medida de la fe;

7. La Iglesia es un ejército comprometido en un **conflicto** espiritual.

La Iglesia está en una lucha espiritual contra Satanás y el pecado. El Espíritu, del cual está llena la Iglesia, es como un guerrero que esgrime la Palabra viva de Dios, para liberar a las personas del dominio de Satanás y conquistar a todo poder de este mundo tenebroso.

Efesios 6:12 (RV-60) Porque no tenemos lucha contra sangre y carne, sino contra principados, contra potestades, contra los gobernadores de las tinieblas de este siglo, contra huestes espirituales de maldad en las regiones celestes.

Efesios 6:17 (RV-60) Y tomad el yelmo de la salvación, y la espada del Espíritu, que es la palabra de Dios;

8. La Iglesia es columna y baluarte de la **verdad**.

1 Timoteo 3:15–16 (RV-60) para que si tardo, sepas cómo debes conducirte en la casa de Dios, que es la iglesia del Dios viviente, columna y baluarte de la verdad.

Judas 3 (RV-60) Amados, por la gran solicitud que tenía de escribiros acerca de nuestra común salvación, me ha sido necesario escribiros exhortándoos que contendáis ardientemente por la fe que ha sido una vez dada a los santos.

9. La Iglesia es un pueblo con **esperanza** futura. Esa esperanza está centrada en el **retorno** de Cristo por su pueblo.

Juan 14:3 (RV-60) Y si me fuere y os preparare lugar, vendré otra vez, y os tomaré a mí mismo, para que donde yo estoy, vosotros también estéis.

10. La Iglesia es **invisible** y visible.

Es invisible porque está unida a todos los creyentes en todas partes del mundo. Es visible porque está formada por las congregaciones locales integradas por vencedores

fieles, y también por lo que dicen ser cristianos pero que están **muertos espiritualmente** y son **tibios**.

Apocalipsis 2:2 (RV-60) Yo conozco tus obras, y tu arduo trabajo y paciencia; y que no puedes soportar a los malos, y has probado a los que se dicen ser apóstoles, y no lo son, y los has hallado mentirosos;

Apocalipsis 2:5 (RV-60) Recuerda, por tanto, de dónde has caído, y arrepíentete, y haz las primeras obras; pues si no, vendré pronto a ti, y quitaré tu candelero de su lugar, si no te hubieres arrepentido.

11. La Iglesia está llena de «**arrugas**» o imperfección.

2019 Men's Ministries Disciples Journey November 9-17, 2019

Overview:

Everyone who travels to the Holy Land returns deeply changed from the experience. This is something I have witnessed firsthand from the people who have traveled with me to the Holy Land. One common result for pastors is that they find their preaching strengthened as their knowledge of the Bible deepens.
